9. CONSIDER AND ADOPT ORDINANCE NO. 1424-2024 AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF CITY OF RIVER OAKS, TEXAS TAX NOTE, SERIES 2024; LEVYING AN ANNUAL AD VALOREM TAX AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF SAID NOTE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND ENACTING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE SUBJECT.

This was approved at the last meeting to move forward with the note. Steve Perry with McCall, Parkhurst and Horton was present. On August 5, 2021, the engineer brought three options to the council: 1 was to fix the water plant, 2 was go to Fort Worth Water, and 3 was to build a new water plant. The council approved fixing the current water plant which was a 3.2-million-dollar improvement. The new clarifier is state of the art, and it will control manganese. The best bid came from Argent Trust with an interest rate of 4.2%. This is a 7-year maximum note but can pay off after two years with no penalties.

Matthew Tatarko, resident, was present and asked some questions and stated information.

CM Forester moved, seconded by CM Rodriguez to approve Ordinance #1424-2024. All voted "Aye",

10. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE NO. 1425-2024 AMENDING THE FY 2024 GENERAL FUND BUDGET BY EXPENDING FUNDS FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT DOLLAR DONATION FUND IN ORDER TO PURCHASE WILDLAND FIREFIGHTING PROTECTIVE GEAR.

This gear for brush fires is lighter weight than the normal gear. The fire fighters have requested this gear.

CM Forester moved, seconded by CM Rodriguez to approve Ordinance #1425-2024. All voted "Aye".

11. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION NO. 1124-2024 TO RECEIVE GRANTS FROM THE MOTOR VEHICLE CRIME PREVENTION AUTHORITY THAT PROVIDES FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES FOR ECONOMIC MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT AND FRAUD-RELATED MOTOR VEHICLE CRIME ENFORCEMENT TEAMS; DESIGNATING THE AUTHORIZED OFFICIAL TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, DECLINE, MODIFY, OR CANCEL THE GRANT APPLICATION FOR THE MOTOR VEHICLE CRIME PREVENTION AUTHORITY GRANT PROGRAM; DESIGNATING A PROGRAM DIRECTOR AND FINANCIAL OFFICER FOR THE GRANT.

This is a continuation from last year and is for flock cameras.

CM Forester moved, seconded by CM Rodriguez to approve Resolution #1124-2024. All voted "Aye".

The city would need to have an engineer to certify the utilities and drainage. The current city engineer will not have time for this project. The cost for the engineer would be re-cooped from the permit fees. The estimated cost would be \$5,000.00. Permit fees estimated costs would be \$437,000.00. Jennifer Gansert is a resident who works for Kimley-Horn & Associates. She also serves on the Storm Water Board and Park Board. She will be leading the team. The City Attorney said there will be no legal conflict of interest.

CM Forester moved, seconded by CM Rodiguez to approve the agreement between the City of River Oaks and Kimley-Horn & Associates Inc. All voted "Aye.

Fire-Fort Worth Council approved this morning a resolution to adopt the recommendation for EMS services. It will be a long process. Fort Worth will cover the costs in 2024-2025, but we will have to start paying subsidies in 2025-2026.
