Mosquito Fogging This Weekend

The City has contracted with Municipal Mosquito for mosquito fogging weather and wind permitting Saturday, July 20th between the hours of 9:00 P.M. and 5:00 A.M Sunday July 21st for the area from Ohio Garden south to Barbara Road and east to west from Churchill to Merritt. INFORMATION ABOUT THE PRODUCT USED TO FOG FOR MOSQUITOES

The product we use for mosquito fogging is a water-based (diluted) product designed to kill insects the body mass of a mosquito or smaller. We chose this class of product because of its quick action and lack of environmental footprint.

The product synergizes and begins acting as soon as it hits the air, providing an immediate kill for its target insects, and is completely done and mostly broken down within about 45 minutes. What little residue remains at that point is completely broken down by the first UV light in the morning. By contrast, oil-based products will leave residue on vegetation, vehicles, etc.

The product is considered reasonably safe for human and pet exposure, and in fact, products available in feed and hardware stores have much higher toxicity than the product we use. Helpful tips for concerned pet owners include bringing them inside or into a protected area for the evening, and emptying water dishes or covering open fish tanks if located near the roadway.

One misconception many have is that our products kill our pollinators, but they don't pose


an issue for them. Bees are a far bigger insect than this mixture will typically affect, and by treating them after dark, pollinators are within their hives rather than out foraging or otherwise directly exposed to the product.

Filters on air conditioning systems are sufficient to filter the product from living spaces or car cabins, so please do not turn off air systems. If one happens to drive behind a fogging truck while it's in operation, wait for the truck to pull over and pass promptly with the windows up and the A/C on recirculate

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

<u>Community Action Partners</u> may offer the most assistance for residents of Tarrant County. They offer free government grant money for hardships, job placement, gas cards for work and other support. The goal is to offer short-term, immediate financial help.

- Rent/mortgage assistance for qualified people to help them stay in their home or apartment. The non-profit will provide help with paying rent or a mortgage for Tarrant County residents.
- Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program (known as CEAP) provides grants and financial assistance with utility bills: electric, gas, and heating bill fuel assistance. In addition, the CEAP program will also repair or replace an existing heater, propane tank, air conditioner, or central air unit.
- Get access to Atmos Energy "Share the Warmth", which aids Atmos Energy customers
 whose income is at or below 200% of Federal Income Guidelines or with extenuating
 circumstances. Assistance from Atmos is limited to once per year.


<u>Tarrant County Department Of Human Services</u> – Services provided by this government agency includes: assistance with paying mortgage, emergency rent and utilities. Another financial assistance program called SUAP Special Utility Assistance Program has limited cash grants that can be used to provide electric and gas service assistance to eligible households up to three times a year from January through August. Cash aid and TANF are also available.

YARD SALES

You may have 2 yard sales in a row, skip a week, then have 2 more for atotal of 4 yard sales per year. Yard sale permits are \$10 each. This allows you 1 permit sign and 2 directional signs. You must have an active water account, in good standing, at the yard sale address. You must also provide a valid United States-issued photo ID with the yard sale address on the ID and the Yard Sale Permit must be purchased 24 hours before the sale. To have your Yard Sale placed in the weekly Newsletter, you must have purchased your Yard Sale Permit prior to the close of the previous business day as the Newsletter is posted on Friday mornings.
