- Oct. 25 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Oct. 26 through 30 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Transportation options include Trinity Metro (buses, ACCESS paratransit, ZIPZONE services in Mercantile, Near Southside and Crowley), Tarrant County Transportation Services, Northeast Transportation Services, and Arlington's Via and Handitran.

Purchased tickets will not be refunded. Those who qualify and want to ride on ACCESS, TCTS, NETS or Handitran should call the provider at least 48 hours ahead of the trip to schedule their free ride to any of the voting locations.


